The best place for a game of hide-and-seek is outside where there is plenty of space to run around. If you want to play inside, ask a grown-up first, as it can be a very noisy game. This is how you play it. The first thing to do is choose a place for 'home'. It could be a tree or a garden shed 26. One player is IT. He stands facing 'home' and hides his eyes. When he calls 'On your marks, get set, go!', all the other players run and hide. While they are hiding, IT counts loudly to fifty or a hundred, or sings a song. When he has finished, he calls 'Coming, ready or not'. All the players must stop where they are.

IT then starts looking for the others. 27 he sees one of the players (for example, Susie who is hiding behind the hedge), he runs back to 'home', touches it and calls out 'Tap tap on Susie behind the hedge'. IT must touch home. He must also say who the player is and 28 she is hiding. If he is right, Susie must come home and be IT in the next game. But if Susie knows that she has been seen, she can try and run for home. If she beats IT home, she can call 'Home free'. This 29 that she is safe and does not have to be IT in the next game.

Whoever is the last one home can free the other players. To do this he has to get home before being 'tapped' by IT. He also has to call 'Home free all!' If he succeeds, IT player has to be IT again in the next game.

If there are some players that IT cannot find, and the game has been going on for a long time, IT is 30 to end the game. To do this he calls 'Ally, ally, all in free', and the players come home then.

[A] I love my parents. They are such wonderful and wise people. Whenever I have a problem or if something goes wrong, they have a magical way of showing me that it's never as bad as it seems. They have always said, "Well, Ron, these things happen. There's no need to get upset about it; we'll work through it." I cannot tell you how comforting it is to hear that.

[B] I remember one time when my mother was taking my sister and me to school. All of a sudden, smoke started coming out of the front of the car. Mom pulled over and got out to see what was going on. This was back in the good old days before cell phones, so Mom had to walk up the street to a local bar in order to use the phone. It was a very stressful situation, but my mom stayed calm and positive throughout. Dad came to pick us up, and instead of cursing or being upset that he had to leave work to come get us or that the car was in need of repair, he just laughed and took us to school and went back to figure out how to get the car to a gas station. They have always had that type of attitude, no matter what problems we faced, large or small, and they have never gotten negative or angry over issues that are out of their control.

[C] One of the main reasons I love them so much is because of the way they view the world—with understanding and acceptance of all the world has to offer, good and bad. They are such positive people, even when facing hardship, and I have tried so hard to adopt that quality myself, and to pass it along to my students.

[D] I recently found out that a former boss of mine was upset with me because of a comment I made that she had taken the wrong way. I am the type of person who likes everyone to be happy, and I hate the thought of having anyone angry with me. I didn't really want to apologize, because I

didn't mean for what I said to be taken the way she perceived it. It was troubling me, though, and when I asked my mother for advice, she told me that I should either write a letter or call the person and explain the situation. I decided to do both. First I wrote a letter, and later I called. Neither worked to smooth over the situation, as my former boss remained cold and distant. It continued to worry me, and I again asked my mother for advice, and she told me something very wise. She said, "Ron, you have taken the pressure off yourself. You did the right thing; you called and did your best to solve the problem. Now the burden is not on you anymore; it is on her. If she chooses to live with it, then let her, but I want you to stop worrying about it."

[E] My mother was right. We can't let things worry us to the point that they make us sick. We have to realize there are some things we can't change, and there are times when there are no easy solutions. It is best to deal with those situations the best we can, take the pressure off of ourselves, and move on.
