The mountain town of Canton is at a height of 6,000 feet. It is surrounded by thick bushes and pine trees.  six years of dry weather, these plants are a major cause of fire. Thousands of trees and tons of bushes are going to be removed over the next five years at a minimum cost of \$3 million. The bushes will be removed first, and then the trees will be cut down and removed. A cleared area, where there is almost nothing likely to catch fire easily, will then safely surround the town of 4,000 people.

Residents look forward to the work, because it will help their town survive a large dangerous fire in the future. “But ,” said one resident. “All the extra trucks are going to make traffic pretty bad. Plus, once the area is cleared, we have to make sure dirt bikers don’t try to make the cleared area their personal playground.”

A recent fire burned 4,000 acres and destroyed 11 homes in nearby Hamilton. The fire was raging toward Canton, but . Residents know that they won’t get lucky twice, so they are looking forward to this massive clearing operation.

Ninety percent of the cutting and clearing will be paid for with federal funds. , if the trees are on private property, they must be paid for by the residents themselves. Prices can range as high as \$1,000 to cut and remove one tree. Officials say that residents can apply for state and federal loans if necessary.

“Well, what good does that do me?” asked Thelma, a 65-year-old widow. “I’m living on \*social security. I’ve got four trees on my property. The government’s not going to loan me money when they know there’s no way I can . So what am I supposed to do? These planners with all their big ideas ought to think of the little people.”

[A] You might think, if you didn't know him well, that he was a stern and serious man. ① He was actually a wildly funny person. ② What made him appear so serious was the fact that he never smiled with his mouth. ③ He did it all with his eyes. ④ He had brilliant blue eyes and when he thought of something funny, his eyes would flash and, if you looked carefully, you could actually see a tiny little golden spark dancing in each eye. But the mouth never moved.

I was glad my father was an eye-smiler. It meant he never gave me a fake smile because it's impossible to make your eyes twinkle if you aren't feeling twinkly yourself. A mouth-smile is different. You can fake a mouth-smile any time you want, simply by moving your lips. I've learned that a real mouth-smile always has an eye-smile to go with it. So watch out, I say, when someone smiles at you with his mouth but his eyes stay the same.

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[B] My father was not what you would call an educated man. I doubt he had read twenty books in his life. But he was a marvelous storyteller. He used to make up a bedtime story for me every single night, and the best ones went on for many nights running.<sup>(33)</sup>

[C] One of them, which must have gone on for at least fifty nights, was about an enormous fellow called "The Big Friendly Giant," or "The BFG" for short. The BFG was three times as tall as an ordinary man and his hands were as big as shopping carts. He lived in a vast cave not far from our home and he only came out into the open when it was dark.<sup>(34)</sup> Inside the cave he had a powder factory where he made more than one hundred different kinds of magic powder.

[D] "The Big Friendly Giant makes his magic powders out of the

dreams that children dream when they are asleep,” he said.

“How?” I asked. “Tell me how, dad.”

“Dreams, my love, are very mysterious things. They float around in the night air like little clouds, searching for sleeping people.”

“Can you see them?” I asked.

“Nobody can see them.”

“Then how does The Big Friendly Giant catch them?”

“Ah,” my father said, “that is the interesting part. A dream, you see, as it goes drifting through the night air, makes a sound so soft and low it is impossible for ordinary people to hear it. But The BFG can hear it easily. His sense of hearing is absolutely fantastic.”

[E] I loved the intent look on my father’s face when he was telling a story. His face was pale and still and distant, unconscious of everything around him.

[F] “The BFG,” he said, “can hear an insect as it walks across a leaf. He can hear ants talking to one another. He can hear the cry of pain a tree gives out when someone cuts into it with an ax. Ah yes, my darling, there is a whole world of sound around us that we cannot hear because our ears are simply not sensitive enough.”

“What happens when he catches the dreams?” I asked.

“He puts them in glass bottles and screws the tops down tight,” my father said. “He has thousands of these bottles in his cave.”

“Does he catch bad dreams as well as good ones?”

“Yes,” my father said. “He catches both. But he only uses the good ones in his powders.”

“What does he do with the bad ones?”

“He explodes them.”

then he would fold his long fingers around my fist, holding it tight.
